One of the oldest and most respected residents of Maryborough-Mrs. Dawson, wife of Mr. William Dawson— passed away on July 11, after a brief illness. The deceased lady, who was in her 70th year, came from Scotland with her father (Mr. Graham) in 1862, by the ship Erin-go-Bragh. She was married in 1863, and with the exception of four years spent in Rockhampton, Bowen, Toowoomba, and Dalby, she spent the whole of her married. life in Maryborough. Mrs. Dawson assisted her husband in his public activities when he was alderman and Mayor of Marybrough, notably in 1887 (Queen Victoria's jubilee year). In addition to her Husband, Mrs. Dawson leaves a family of two sons and one daughter—Messrs R G. and J. G. Dawson, and Mrs. J Lindley (Toowoomba).

MARYBOROUGH IDENTITY DEATH OF MR. WILLIAM DAWSON MARYBOROUGH GH. October 21.

The death of Mr. William Dawson, one of Maryborough's most honoured citizens for the past 50 years, occurred yesterday, at Toow'oomlm at the residence of his daughter, Mrs. C. Lindley. Deceased was born at Clayton Le Moore, Lancashire, in 1839, and came io Australia by thec ship Soldenau, In 1862. He laid practically, resided here since that date. Deceased took a great interest in public life, and was associated with many important movements, principally through, the Municipal Council, He was Mayor on four occasions, last in 1887, the jubilee year of Queen Victoria, and subsequently in 1 905-6-7. The late Mr. Dawson was a prominent Freemason and Oddfellow, and was a Past Grand Master of the former craft. During his residence at Pialba he was chairman of the Pialba Shire Council. He was an elder of the Maryborough Prcsbyterian Church for some years. He is survived by two sons, Robert G. Dawson and James G. Dawson, of Maryborough, and a daughter, Mrs. Lindley, Toowoomba. The body was brought from Toowoomba, and will be interred late this morning.

DEATH OF MR. R. G. DAWSON MOURNED

THE death occurred early on Saturday morning of Mr. Robert Graham Dawson, a well known Maryborough business man, sportsman and churchman. A son of lhe late Mr, and Mrs. William Dawson, the deceased wac 'knrn in Marvboroucr on De cember 9. 1863. His passing severs another link with early day Maryborough. The late Mr. R. G-Dawson as a boy attended the old Primary School (formerly situated in Alice street) when Mr. Hercules Smi'li was headmaster. He passed the rfciiolar^hip examination 'in 1877 and later studied at the Brisbane Grammar school.

The late Mr. Dawson's business career began when he joined the firm of Younc and Company, mer chants. Marj borough. Later, when his father opened up business as a newsagent, the deceased became associated with him. the firm being known as W. Dawson and Son. booksellers and stationers. He was actively associated with that firm J until ill-health forced him to rc- j tire about 18 monlhs ago.

All his life the late Mr. Dawson had been a keen follower of sport. He was a foundation member of ?he Doort Villa Bowling Club, hav ing joined when the green was situated in the late Hon. A. H. Wilson's property. Doon Villa. As far as is known-only one founda tion member of the club is now left. In recognition of his services 'o the club, both as a player and as a committeeman. Mr. Dawson was elected a life member. Iie was also a member of the Kent-stret bowl ing Club for many years.

INTEREST IN SPORT

In his younger days other sports including rowing, cricket and rifle shooiing claimed his attention. He

was a member of the Maryborough Rowing Club, and among cricket ers was regarded as a good class bowler. He was a member of the Rifle Club when the butts were at Granville. In the early 80's he joined the Volunteer Defence Corps and hold the rank of colour sergeant in C. Company

Durng Ihe Jast war the late Mr. Dawson worked in the interests of soldiers, and was one of the fore- 1 most members of the Patriotic Committee, of which he was trea surer for a period. He was also i connected with the eisteddfod movement in Maryborough many years ago and was at one time secretary. In earlier years he was associated with the Chamber of Commerce.

Keenly interested in lodge work, the Inte Mr. Dawson was a mem ber of the Loyal Perseverance Lodge of the Oddfellows, of which body he was secretary for 32 .years. He passed through the var ious chairs until he reached the honoured position of Noble Grand, an ofTice which he filled with great I credit to himself and benefit to, the lodge.

DEVOTED CHURCHMAN

The deceased had a lifelong as sertion with St. Stephen's Pres byterian Church. He was a pupil in the early-day Presbyterian Sabbath School in which he later became a teacher. A» a member of the committee of management of the church he perfoimei yeo man servicc and for several terms was chairman. He also was sec retary of the committee at one stage.

The late Mr. Dawron. whose wife predeceased h:m by four years, is survived by one son — Mr. Forbes Dawson - Warrawceno. via Burke. N.S.W.) two daughters, the Misses Margaret and Winnifred' Dawson (M'boro.) — and a grandson, as well as one sister. Mrs. M. H. Lindley -Toowoomba- and one brother, Mr. Jas. G. Dawson (M'boro).

At the funeral which moved from St. Stephen's church on Saturday afternoon there were a representative gathering of business men. A large number of Doon Villa Bowling Club members formed a guard of honour from the church to the hearse. At the graveside the Rev. J. McPhail paid tribute to the life and work of the late Mr. Dawson.
